Applies to all Medical Staff Members providing moderate (conscious) sedation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physician/Practitioner must be a member of the Medical Staff or Allied Health Professional Staff at Summit Healthcare Regional Medical Center. • Physician/Practitioner follows the Summit Healthcare Sedation/Analgesia policy. • Current certificate in ACLS (PALS for pediatric patients) with 3 month grace period for expired certificates
CURRENT COMPETENCE (INITIAL APPOINTMENT)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Required previous experience: Applicant must be able to demonstrate successful performance of at least 20 moderate sedation procedures within the past 24 months, OR • Review of the moderate sedation video and satisfactory completion with a score >70% of the post-video case study. OR • For providers who completed a residency/fellowship training program within the past 24 months, a letter from the program director indicating current competence to perform moderate sedation.
MAINTENANCE OF PRIVILEGE CRITERION (Renewed at each reappointment)	<p>Current demonstrated competence with a minimum of 20 moderate sedation procedures within the past 24 months with acceptable results based on results of quality assessment/improvement activities and outcomes, OR</p> <p>Review of the moderate sedation video and satisfactory completion with a score >70% of the post-video case study.</p>

Definitions:

Moderate Sedation is defined as the administration of any pharmacological agent which will likely cause a medically controlled state of depressed consciousness. This state would be limited to short periods and utilized for diagnostic and therapeutic procedures that 1) allow protective reflexes to be maintained, 2) retain the patient's ability to maintain a patent airway, respiratory rate and rhythm and 3) permit expected responses by the patient to physical stimulation and verbal command. Administration of such agents, at doses not expected to cause a state of depressed consciousness, for the purpose of controlling pain or reducing anxiety, is outside the scope of this policy.

Deep Sedation is a state of depressed consciousness as the result of drug administration in which the patient is not easily roused by verbal stimulation and has inhibition of normal airway reflexes.

Monitored Anesthesia Care is defined as those procedures in which an anesthesia provider has been called upon to provide specific anesthesia services to a particular patient undergoing a planned procedure, in connection with which a patient receives local anesthesia or, in some cases, no anesthesia at all. In such a case, the anesthesia provider is providing specific services to the patient and is in control of the patient's non-surgical or non-obstetrical medical care, including the responsibility of monitoring of the patient's vital signs, and is available to administer anesthetics or provide other medical care as appropriate.
